NEW WAREHOUSE

In January 2024, the SERVE 6.8 team purchased and moved into a new 15,000 sq. foot facility in Loveland, CO. This move combined all SERVE 6.8 offices, warehousing, and distribution into one central location.

This central location allows SERVE 6.8 to engage volunteers and donors from the community and churches to create a streamlined process for intaking and sending resources to local families.



RESOURCE CENTERS

SERVE 6.8 partnered with 10 churches to host Resource Centers with food, clothing, financial assistance, employment guidance, legal consultation, and budgeting. SERVE 6.8 supported an additional 3 church food pantries.


PROJECTS

SERVE 6.8 supported 107 families with summer projects, such as: yard work, painting, moving and small home repairs.

SERVE 6.8 partners with church and community groups to meet the needs of our neighbors through project outreaches.



SERVE 6.8 provides project teams for single moms, widows, the elderly and other vulnerable populations and continues to serve families every May -September.







SERVE 6.8 is ready to mobilize at a moments notice to respond to disasters and immediately meet needs of families in crisis.

Disaster Resource Centers: provided air purifiers, food, hygiene, clothing, and financial assistance to 144 families. Sent snacks and care packages to 20 Fire Stations.






SERVE 6.8 responded to local fires in August 2024: the Alexander Mountain Fire and Stone Quarry Fires through supporting churches with shelters, feeding, Disaster Resource Centers, project work, sandbagging and case management.

SERVE 6.8 also worked with churches in Roswell, NM to network churches together after fires and partnered with Timberline Church to send a disaster project team to a church in Hendersonville, North Carolina.

ADOPT-A-FAMILY

Adopt-A-Family provides Thanksgiving meals and Christmas gifts to families across northern Colorado through Church Connection Events, where families can experience a family fun event, pick up their meal or gifts, and be invited into a church community. Adopt-A-Family is resourced through the generosity of the community donating through **617 Giving Trees** hosted by local businesses and churches.



SERVE 6.8 is a privately funded 501c3 nonprofit reliant on the generosity of the community.


Food, clothing, hygiene, households, school supplies, emergency relief supplies, sandbags, toys, and gift cards are donated by churches, businesses, and individuals.

SERVE 6.8 meets the physical needs of families throughout its ministry activity.
